Federal regulations require that greater disclosures of potential financial conflicts of interest be made to the University and the PHS when an "Investigator" (key personnel named in the proposal or award and anyone responsible, fully or in part, for the design, conduct or reporting of the research) participates in PHS-funded research than in most other sponsored research contexts. University compliance with these rules is a condition for submitting applications for, or accepting PHS funding. These disclosure rules also apply to other agencies that require compliance with PHS requirements. Notably, PHS rules require the University, not the Investigator, to make the initial judgment as to whether there is a significant financial conflict of interest as defined by PHS.
