HIGHLIGHTS AND KEY FINDINGS



CLASS HIGHLIGHTS

The Roche Family Center for Career Development conducted its annual First Destination Survey of graduates of The University of Scranton over a 12-month period from their graduation. We also report 6-month data to the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE). These are consistent with their First Destination Survey Standards and Protocols.

Key Findings for the Class of 2023

- After utilizing in-person surveys, emails, phone calls and professional networking sites to ascertain postgraduation status, information was collected from 356 of the 494 individuals who graduated from Summer 2022 through Spring 2023 (per Office of the Registrar). This yielded a 72% knowledge rate¹. Of the 356 students who responded to the survey 356 found success, yielding a 100% success rate.²
- The overall mean annual salary for the class of 2023 was \$89,891,3 a notable increase from the \$81,045 average for class of 202





5. Starting salary information is based on the 157 graduates who self-reported their salary. This represents a 46% salary knowledge rate (157/345) for the salary question on the survey for those who gained full-time employment in the United States, a notable increase from a 32% salary knowledge rate (110/341) for the Class of 2022. Average starting salary is only listed for majors in which more than one graduate provided information.
